What Is Going On At Mass?

As we begin to examine the Eucharistic Prayer we look at what Jesus himself said and did. Saint Paul and Saint Luke indicate that Jesus "gave thanks". According to Saint Matthew and Saint Mark, he "said a blessing". This reveals to us that Jesus said a blessing prayer of thanksgiving that was customary among the Jewish people. The ritual of the Passover meal, which may have been the setting for the institution of the first celebration of the Eucharist, included such a prayer.

The Jewish table prayers were recited at every meal. Near the start of the meal, the father of the family or the one presiding over the community would take bread and speak a blessing (barakah) which praised God, saying: "Blessed are you, Lord, our God, king of the universe, who has brought forth bread from heaven.: The bread was then broken and given to the participants, and the people began to eat. When the meal was nearly over, the presider prayed a second and longer barakah over a cup of wine. This blessing had three parts: 1) praise of God for his creation; 2) thanksgiving for his redemptive work in the past; and 3) supplication for the future, that God's saving works would continue in their lives and be brought to the climax in the sending of the Messiah. This structure and content was found in early Eucharistic prayers and is still present today.

It makes sense that Jesus prayed in the pattern of the Jewish people of his day. What was different, and what changes these prayers for us, is that Jesus said, "This is My Body. This is My Blood." With these words Jesus clearly declared the promises fulfilled in himself.

So, how do our humble gifts of bread and wine, the work of human hands, become the true Body and Blood of Jesus Christ?

At this point in the Mass, the priest extends his hands, palms downward, over the chalice and ciborium, and traces the sign of the cross over them. With this gesture, he requests God the Father to pour out his blessing over these gifts and to send the Holy Spirit so that the bread and wine offered may become Christ's Body and Blood.

This invocation of the Holy Spirit upon the gifts is known as the Epiclesis of the Eucharistic Prayer. It is through the power of the Holy Spirit, who descended upon the apostles at Pentecost, that the priest, through his hands, offers the human gifts and earthly elements to be consecrated into Godly gifts and heavenly realities.

Along with this invocation you may hear the ringing of the bells calling our attention to this significant moment. The moment where we ask the Holy Spirit to make our humble gifts of bread and wine worthy for the sacrifice of Mass. Although some may note that the bell is a tradition from times past when people often didn't know the language of the prayers, in all honesty, many of us will recognize that we still need a call to attention so we don't miss these important moments!
