What Is Going On At Mass?

An the end of the Great Amen, the congregation rises to its feet and the priest extends the invitation, "At our Savior's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say..."

We of course, respond with The Lord's Prayer. This prayer is the first part of the Communion Rite, given to us by Jesus in the Gospels (Matthew 6:9-13; Luke 11:2-4). These are the very words that Jesus gave us to pray!

"Our Father..." Jesus taught us to approach God as a child talks to his father. We are his sons and daughters and we call upon Him in a most intimate and familial term: Father. Jesus desires that we approach our Father with the serenity and confidence of children. Not only does he reveal this, but in a certain sense he commands it when he says, "When you pray, pray like this...Our Father!" We dare to call God our Father because Jesus said we could! Perhaps this is why the priest said, in the invitation to pray, "we dare to say."

Think about it. Among some of the first words we learn as young children are "mommy" and "daddy." This is true for all different kinds of people with all different kinds of languages. In some ways, these words are really central to who we are—people in relation to others. When Jesus taught us to pray, he said we should begin by saying, "Our Father." If a good translation of "Abba" is "Daddy," just think about how close God wants us to be! So close, in fact, that we could call him by a name that even a young child could recognize. What an amazing gift! What an amazing sharing in the life of God! No wonder we can pray with confidence—we have a Loving Father who loves us deeply and perfectly!

The word "Our" in this prayer is also significant. It points to the deep unity we have together by virtue of our common heavenly Father. All who are united in Christ are truly brothers and sister in him. Through Christ, Jesus' Father has become our Father and we all are the Father's children in the covenant family of God. Sit back and think for even a few minutes about what that means. God is our Father; we are his children. Amazing! If you ever need a meditation or find yourself with a few extra minutes to think and pray, just think about those two special words: "Our Father."

The Lord's Prayer itself is a model of prayer. It beseeches the Father, it praises and blesses Him, it recognizes His Divinity and His Majesty. It asks and intercedes, asks pardon of our sins, avoidance of temptation and a deliverance from evil. It is so fitting we call upon our Father God in such a great prayer as we prepare to receive His great gifts. In this proximate preparation for Holy Communion, we are asking the Father for the gift of His Son. Unworthy as we are, we pray this in confidence, knowing of His infinite mercy and desire to share His gifts with us.

The Four Routes To Indianapolis

For five years, Catholics from across the United States have anticipated this past week. On May 17th the final journeys began as pilgrims processed, with the Blessed Sacrament, across this great land from the North, South, East, and West.

The Marian (Northern) Route began in Minnesota. The Elizabeth Ann Seton (Eastern) Route began in Connecticut. The St. Juan Die-

go (Southern) Route began in Texas. The St. Junipero Serra (Western) Route began in California. Two months on the road, traveling in the heat, the wind, and the rain, with over 100,000 participants, traversing 6,500 miles to reach Indianapolis ended on Tuesday. Forty pilgrims (ten from each route) dedicated themselves to traveling the entire route including many miles on foot. Think of the sacrifice of these individuals.

These four routes converged July 16th at St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church, downtown Indianapolis, at a Mass over which Archbishop Thompson presided. The Mass brought an end to the pilgrimage and set the stage for the beginning of the Tenth National Eucharistic Congress—the first in over eighty years. This congress concludes today with over 50,000 Catholics taking part in the National Eucharistic Congress Closing Mass at Lucas Oil Stadium.
