What Is Going On At Mass?

Now that the gifts have been presented, placed on the altar, and the priest has washed his hands, he reads a prayer over the offerings. This prayer is read as it is unique to this particular Mass. In this prayer the priest will ask some grace in connection with the mystery celebrated on this particular day. This grace is sought in return for the material gifts presented gifts which the priest acknowledges as being inadequate to the goodness and power of God. And yet, we know that our gifts to God will be returned to us, multiplied a hundredfold!

Listening to this prayer, you may hear words like sacrifices, offerings, gifts, prayers and oblations as the priest requests that God accept what we offer with sincerity. He also asks that these gifts be sanctified and transformed.

Hearing mention of sacrifice, we recall one of the great truths about the Mass: it truly is the one sacrifice of Christ. In the Mass, the perfect sacrifice of Christ on the Cross is re-presented to us. In the traditional understanding of a sacrifice, we need a priest, a victim/offering, and an altar. For Christ's perfect sacrifice, Jesus is both the priest and victim/offering; that is, he offers himself in sacrifice on the altar of the cross. The Mass is our access to that sacrifice and its many fruits.

Remember, we are not just spectators at the Mass; we don't just sit back and watch what Jesus does. We have been invited to take part and to unite with Christ in offering our own sacrifices. As we reflect on this part of the Mass, we join our prayers and offerings to the perfect offering of Jesus. But, the sacrificial offering dose not end with what we place in the collection basket. St. Paul instructs us in his First Letter to the Corinthians (10:31) "What ever you eat, whatever you drink, whatever you do at all, do it for the glory of God." He further adds in his Letter to the Colossians (3:17) "And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."

That offering, that sacrifice does not end once this part of Mass is over. Each of us is asked to live our life in such as way that it glorifies the one who made it all possible. So, let each of us consciously make a spiritual offering to God this week. The meal you prepare; offer it to God. The game you play; offer it to God. The assistance you provide others; offer it to God. The work you do; offer it to God.

Mentally bring these offerings to Mass next week. Offer them to God and unite them to the sacrifice of Jesus Christ during the Prayer over the Offering.


